DIARY and EVENTS UPDATE

The Midland Counties Athletics Association have cancelled ALL Track and Field Championships due to take place this summer, along with the Autumn six-stage and four-stage Road Relays on Saturday September 19th.

The National Road Relays are once again expected to be a virtual race due to Birmingham City Council not allowing the use of Sutton Park for such events.

The cross-country relays at Chaddesley Corbett on Saturday 17th October is said to be unlikely to take place, but there is slightly more optimism regarding the Midland 7 and 5 mile race at Bulwell Hall in Nottingham on Saturday 21st November.

Birmingham League and Midland League cross country races will not take place this year, with current plans for a reduced season starting in January 2021.

RunBritain have issued updated guidance on road races, but the Great Birmingham Run half marathon in October has been cancelled.



OLLIE'S TRACK TIME TRIALS - TAKE TWO!

The second of Ollie Wright's track time trial events saw 22 runners line up to once again burn up our 350 metre track in a variety of distances.

Stewart Greenhalgh was our sole 100m sprinter and in his second round ran a cracking time of 11.1 seconds, whilst George Allen ran 600 metres in 2 mins 00.5 secs.

Six runners took part in the most popular event, the 1200 metres.

Matesuz Sliwinski was first in 3:31.6, Sarah Thompson second in 3:56.4 and Alex Taylor third in 4:24.5

Peter Dear took the 1500 metres in 4:12.9 with Eleanor Stark first lady in 5:17.1,

Richard White won the mile in 5:04.0 and

Sam Mannings was first in the 2000 metres in 6:07.7.

Special thanks also go to our supreme pacemaking team of Marc, David, Mark, Richard, Peter and Mateusz and to all who helped officiate and organise the event.

BMC TRAFFORD OPEN

Two Halesowen athletes travelled to Manchester as the British Milers Club held their first socially distanced meeting at the Longford Park Stadium in Stretford.

Despite COVID-19 restrictions meaning that all races were run in lanes, Katrina Simpson and Joe Rogers battled a two lap stagger and two other competitors, and both came away with victories.

ENGLAND ATHLETICS 5k

Away from the action on the track, two of our athletes competed in the inaugural England Athletics Virtual 5k Road Running Championships which attracted a field of over 1,700 runners.

David Lewis was 550th in 18:33 and although Jamie Sircom was at one point in eighth place overall courtesy of an early morning Saturday run, he slid down the table throughout the weekend to finish 1,231st with a time of 22:29.

CROSS COUNTRY PRESENTATION EVENING

The Halesowen Cross Country Presentation Evening, celebrating the club's achievements during the 2019-20 season, was finally held on Saturday 18th July.
